Tied with string only. **NO BROWN BAGS!** Advertisements and supplements that **NEWSPAPER:**

come in your newspaper **CAN** be recycled.

NO: Junk Mail, Magazines, Cardboard or Paper Bags.

Clear, Brown and Green. Remove caps and rings; labels can stay on. **GLASS:**

> NO: Mirrors, Window Panes, Glass Doors, Windshields, Light Bulbs, Ceramics, Crystal or Pyrex.

TIN/ALUMINUM CANS: Rinse and remove labels. Items such as vegetable, dog/cat food cans.

Paint, Aerosol Cans, Chemical or Hazardous Material Containers NO:

PETE - Polyethylene Terephthalate **PLASTIC BOTTLES:** - High Density Polyethlene

- Vinyl

- Low Density Polyethlene

PP - Polypropylene

OTHER OTHER -Other

Rinse and look for code (1-7) on the bottom of the containers for identification of plastics.

NO: Motor oil containers, plastic bags, wrap, non-coded plastic containers, plastic buckets larger than 5 gallons.

ALUMINUM FOIL AND PANS: Rinse to remove food

The above materials can be mixed together for curbside collection, except for the newspaper.

NEWSPAPERS <u>must</u> be kept separate.

PORT JERVIS MUNICIPAL CODE

§ 457-10 Receptacle specifications.

A.

All refuse and garbage shall be stored and placed in watertight metal or plastic receptacles having handles and covers. Receptacles shall have a capacity of not less than 10 gallons nor more than 35 gallons.

В.

The City shall not be liable for any damage caused to a plastic receptacle by cold weather.

C.

Any liner used in a receptacle must be biodegradable.

D.

Paper bags or boxes are not acceptable and will not be collected.

[Amended 7-23-1990 by L.L. No. 8-1990]

F.

The property owner is responsible for providing acceptable receptacles for each living unit on his or her property.

§ 457-12 Collection regulations; fees.

[Amended 5-14-1990 by L.L. No. 7-1990; 7-23-1990 by L.L. No. 8-1990]

Α.

Residential structures shall be provided with one collection per week. Only containers specified in § **457-10A** shall be allowed and shall be limited to four containers.

В.

The collection day shall be determined by the Director of Public Works, in his sole discretion.

C.

All garbage and refuse must be properly packaged in approved receptacles or properly bundled to be collected.

D.

Collection services shall not be provided to commercial or industrial establishments.[1]

E.

Only solid wastes generated within the City of Port Jervis are eligible for collection, either weekly or in special cleanups

<u>As of February 1, 2016</u> – YOU MUST HAVE A VALID PERMIT FROM THE CITY CLERKS OFFICE WITH ID PROOF OF CITY ADDRESS TO DUMP. TICKETS ARE LIMITED TO 12 PER HOUSEHOLD A YEAR AT \$10.00 PER TICKET.

ONLY PICKUP TRUCK LOADS OR SMALL TRAILERS LESS THAN 5'X9' ARE PERMITTED.

ALL OTHERS MUST GO TO THE TRANSFER STATION AND PAY ACCORDINGLY.



MEDICAL SHARPS (NEEDLES) DISPOSAL FACILITIES

The proper way to prepare the medical sharps for disposal is to place them in a sealed, leak-proof and puncture resistant container such as a wide-mouth laundry detergent bottle or glass bottle/jar with a screw-on-lid. Containers can be obtained at your local pharmacy. **DO NOT** place medical sharps into metal containers such as coffee cans, since metal cans are not leak-proof.
