












## Container 1

### What You CAN Recycle:



### YES

- Glass bottles (green, clear, brown)
- Aluminum cans
- Tin and bi-metallic containers (including aerosol cans)
- Plastic containers (PET plastic #1, HDPE plastic #2, PVC plastic #3, LDPE plastic #4, PP plastic #5, PS plastic #6, other plastic #7)
- Milk cartons
- Juice boxes
- Aluminum foil (pie plates)
- White refrigerated/frozen food containers



### NO

- Pots, pans, utensils and other cookware
- Ceramic and china dinnerware
- Plastic buckets, planters, baskets and recycle bins
- Containers that held a hazardous material (Oil, antifreeze, pool and yard chemicals, spackle, oil-based paints, etc.)
- Plastic bags (recyclable at Orange County Transfer Stations)
- Styrofoam
- Light bulbs
- Metal or plastic hangers
- Toys
- IV bags, medical waste and containers containing medical sharps

- Construction paper

- Junk mail (including envelopes and coupons)
- Computer printout and fax/phot copy paper
- Chipboard/boxboard paper egg cartons
- Corrugated containers (including pizza boxes)

### NO

- Paper soiled with grease, food, paint, etc.
- Wax-coated paper
- Paper cups
- Tissues, toilet paper, paper towel, napkins
- Paper items with layers of plastic or foil
- Hard covered books (remove covers and/or spiral before recycling)
- Paper used for animal training or bedding
- Cat litter

## PREPARING RESIDENTIAL RECYCLABLES

### NEWSPAPER:

Tied with string only. **NO BROWN BAGS!** Advertisements and supplements that come in your newspaper **CAN** be recycled.

**NO:** Junk Mail, Magazines, Cardboard or Paper Bags.

### GLASS:

Clear, Brown and Green. Remove caps and rings; labels can stay on.


**NO:** Mirrors, Window Panes, Glass Doors, Windshields, Light Bulbs, Ceramics, Crystal or Pyrex.

### TIN/ALUMINUM CANS:

Rinse and remove labels. Items such as vegetable, dog/cat food cans.

**NO:** Paint, Aerosol Cans, Chemical or Hazardous Material Containers


### PLASTIC BOTTLES:

PETE  - Polyethylene Terephthalate

HDPE  - High Density Polyethylene


V  - Vinyl

LDPE  - Low Density Polyethylene

PP  - Polypropylene

PS  - Polystyrene

OTHER  -Other

Rinse and look for code  (1-7) on the bottom of the containers for identification of plastics.

**NO:** Motor oil containers, plastic bags, wrap, non-coded plastic containers, plastic buckets larger than 5 gallons.

### ALUMINUM FOIL AND PANS: Rinse to remove food

The above materials can be mixed together for curbside collection, except for the newspaper.

NEWSPAPERS **must** be kept separate.

## PORT JERVIS MUNICIPAL CODE

### § 457-10 Receptacle specifications.

A.

All refuse and garbage shall be stored and placed in watertight metal or plastic receptacles having handles and covers. Receptacles shall have a capacity of not less than 10 gallons nor more than 35 gallons.

B.

The City shall not be liable for any damage caused to a plastic receptacle by cold weather.

C.

Any liner used in a receptacle must be biodegradable.

D.

Paper bags or boxes are not acceptable and will not be collected.

E.

The property owner is responsible for providing acceptable receptacles for each living unit on his or her property.

### § 457-12 Collection regulations; fees.

[Amended 5-14-1990 by L.L. No. 7-1990; 7-23-1990 by L.L. No. 8-1990]

A.

Residential structures shall be provided with one collection per week. Only containers specified in § 457-10A shall be allowed and shall be limited to four containers.

B.

The collection day shall be determined by the Director of Public Works, in his sole discretion.

C.

All garbage and refuse must be properly packaged in approved receptacles or properly bundled to be collected.

D.

Collection services shall not be provided to commercial or industrial establishments.<sup>(1)</sup>

E.

Only solid wastes generated within the City of Port Jervis are eligible for collection, either weekly or in special cleanups

**\*\*\*ALL LOADS MUST BE ACCOMPANIED BY TICKET OWNER WITH POSITIVE PROOF OF ID\*\*\***

### NO EXCEPTIONS

**\*\*\*ALLOWED:** FURNITURE, CARPETING, CLOTHING, PERMITS ARE NOT NEEDED FOR BRUSH, BRANCHES.

**\*\*\*NOT ALLOWED:** GARBAGE, OIL, PAINT CANS, NEWSPAPER, WOOD, BATTERIES, METALS, WHITE GOODS, PROPANE GAS TANKS, CONSTRUCTION DEBRIS, TIRES, ETC.

**As of February 1, 2016** – YOU MUST HAVE A VALID PERMIT FROM THE CITY CLERKS OFFICE WITH ID PROOF OF CITY ADDRESS TO DUMP. TICKETS ARE LIMITED TO 12 PER HOUSEHOLD A YEAR AT \$10.00 PER TICKET.

ONLY PICKUP TRUCK LOADS OR SMALL TRAILERS LESS THAN 5'X9' ARE PERMITTED.

ALL OTHERS MUST GO TO THE TRANSFER STATION AND PAY ACCORDINGLY.

## **MEDICAL SHARPS (NEEDLES) DISPOSAL FACILITIES**

The proper way to prepare the medical sharps for disposal is to place them in a sealed, leak-proof and puncture resistant container such as a wide-mouth laundry detergent bottle or glass bottle/jar with a screw-on-lid. Containers can be obtained at your local pharmacy. **DO NOT** place medical sharps into metal containers such as coffee cans, since metal cans are not leak-proof.

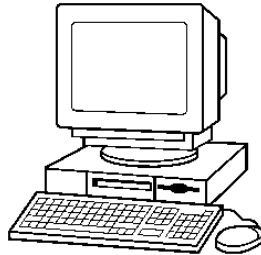
