Summer Program

Playgrounds and Youth Center

We have concluded our 6 week summer program. The 6-week program ended on Friday August 9, 2013. Attendance at the playgrounds and Youth Center has been terrific this summer. We re-opened Farnum Park this year and had a great turnout there. Below is a breakdown of the playgrounds and the Youth Center. Playgrounds and the Youth Center were open Monday – Friday from 9:00 am – 4:00 pm.

Youth Center

The Youth Center has been busy this summer. We have averaged close to 42 kids per day! Total attendance for the year is 3,244 kids and the unduplicated total is 392 kids. The center was open Monday-Friday from 9 am - 4 pm. We held special events each day which included Bowling Day, Arts and Crafts Day and Movie Day.

West End Beach

It has been quite an interesting summer for the beach. First we opened up a week late due to high river conditions and then we had to shut the beach down for multiple days on two separate occasions again due to high river conditions. Despite all that we have had decent attendance throughout the summer. The beach is scheduled to close on Sunday August 18.

This was also our first year charging \$5 a carload for non-residents on weekends. This policy was approved by the Recreation Commission and Common Council to help control over crowding issues with nonresidents we have experienced on weekends the past few years. We formed a Beach Attendant position and this person was stationed at the entrance to the beach and checked every vehicle that wished to enter the beach area. To date we have collected over \$1000 in parking fees. This person also helped beach goers park their vehicles which helped us keep an organized and safe parking area. This new fee and position was a homerun and we had very minimal problems this season. Thank you to the Commission and Council for approving this much needed position!

Summer Lunch Program The summer lunch program began on Monday, July 8 and ended on Friday, August 9. Lunches were served at Church Street Playground, Farnum Playground, Riverside Park and the Youth Center at 12 pm. This is the 18^{th} summer we have participated in this program, and we have served approximately 17, 000 to the kids over the years. Lunches are prepared by the Port Jervis School District, and the program is funded by the New York State Education Department. We served an average of 65 lunches per day.

Rotary Skateboard Park

The skateboard park is open Monday-Friday 12 pm -4 pm and weekends 12 pm -6 pm.

Programs offered

<u>Hockey</u> – was held at Church Street Monday, Wednesday, and Friday mornings averaging 15-25 boys and girls. The program ended on August 7. Goal scoring Champion this year was Abner Padin with 87 goals! Congratulations! Instructors were Mike Cordisco and Dave Simmons.

Softball –was held every Friday afternoon at Riverside Park. The program averaged 18-25 boys and girls. The program ended on August 2. Instructor was Dave Simmons.

<u>**Tennis**</u> – held at Church Street Park every Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday mornings. Approximately 25-30 youth participated in this program. Instructors were Ashley Jackson and Theodore Wolf.

Basketball – held at Church St. Park Tuesdays and Thursday afternoons for boys and girls ages 8-16. The program ended on August 6. More than 80 boys and girls participated. Instructor was Mike Cordisco.

<u>Soccer Camp</u> – The 5th annual soccer stars camp was held this summer at the high school. Two one-week camps were held for boys and girls ages 5-18. Each camp week averaged 30 soccer players. This camp was very successful and we look to it returning, again, next year. Instructor was Taylor Hartey.

<u>Cooking-</u> was held at Farnum Playground every Tuesday afternoon. Pariticpanst, known as "The Little Chefs of Port Jervis Recreation" prepared the food, cooked the food and ate the food. We averaged 20 kids. The last class of program kids baked over 800 cookies which were then given out at National Night Out. Instructor was Kathy Shortell.

<u>Track</u> – held every Tuesday and Thursday evening (6-8 pm)at the Port Jervis High School Track. The program averages approximately 20 boys and girls. This program will end on August 15 when we host the PJ REC Track Finals. Events will include the 50M, 100M and 400 M runs, Long Jump, High Jump, Discuss and Shot Put. Instructors are Sydnie and Mackenzie Leroy.
