

ADA meeting held on June 15th 2020 via Zoom.

Kelly Decker:

I'm gonna record now. All right. Uh, I just need everybody. I have to do a roll call vote. So basically what I'll do is I'll say your name. Just say your first name, your last name, and say, "Present". Uh, Robin, you're, you're also recording, too?

Um, I wasn't going to.

Kelly Decker:

Oh. Okay. So I have a-

Do you need me to?

Kelly Decker:

... I have it recorded. Okay.

Robin Waizenegger:

Okay.

Kelly Decker:

So, uh, Stanley?

Stanley Siegel:

Stanley Siegel. Present.

Kelly Decker:

Uh, Kelly Decker, present. Regis?

Regis Foster:

Regis Foster. Present.

Kelly Decker:

Robin?

Robin Waizenegger:

Robin Waizenegger. Present.

Kelly Decker:

Jen?

Jennifer Foster:

Jennifer Foster. Present.

Kelly Decker:

Uh, Annie?

Anne Foster:

Annie Foster. Present.

Kelly Decker:

Jack?

Jack Farr:

Jack Farr. Present.

Kelly Decker:

Uh, Melissa?

Melissa Decker:

Melissa Decker. Present.

Kelly Decker:

Thanks. Katie, you can't hear us? It doesn't say that she's muted. Katie, can you hear us? All right. If she catches up. Um, go ahead, Jen.

Group Member:

Thank you.

Jennifer Foster:

All right.

Anne Foster:

Jack, Jack didn't send me anything.

Jennifer Foster:

Do you have any issues or anything? Hey, Jack.

Group Member:

No.

Jack Farr:

Yes.

Jennifer Foster:

Okay. Uh, we, we didn't receive anything from... Is there anything that we should be addressing now?

Jack Farr:

Well, the only thing we talked about at the last meeting was the issue out on Main Street.

Jennifer Foster:

Right.

Jack Farr:

Um, we did send the engineers and DOT out to check.

Jennifer Foster:

Right.

Jack Farr:

the only one they see that issue with, and they corrected, was the one on the corner of Penn Avenue and Main Street.

Jennifer Foster:

Okay.

Jack Farr:

Um, so they did go out and check all those, um, out there on Main Street. And they're going to come in again in a couple weeks to do a full inspection, so if there's any issues, um, that's when they'll all arise.

Jennifer Foster:

Okay.

Robin Waizenegger:

As a side note, is that full inspection, Jack, for the bridge completed?

Jack Farr:

Well, D- DOT, will have to come in and do a full inspection on the bridge and all of the work that was done according to contract.

Robin Waizenegger:

Right. Okay.

Jack Farr:

So we're hoping to get him in in the next two to three weeks.

Robin Waizenegger:

Mm-hmm (affirmative).

Stanley Siegel:

Are the signal buttons at Pike Street, are they hooked up yet?

Jack Farr:

Yes. I believe so. The pre-emp devices all got completed last week. I spoke to the fire chief. He assured me he's going to go out this week and test every one of them to make sure they're all working.

Kelly Decker:

There is a missing, uh, pedestal, though, if you're walking from DB Mart to the Bank of Chicago. There's no pedestal there.

Jack Farr:

That's getting moved and going behind the sidewalk. We wanted to move it, so they're waiting for that to come in.

Jack Farr:

So we were concerned that it was going to get hit with cars on that corner, so we moved it behind the sidewalk.

Jennifer Foster:

Okay. Can I just go over something here, so I've got everything down here? So you're saying the engineer is going to be sent out on Main Street to do a full inspection. Is that correct, Jack?

Jack Farr:

Yes. D- Uh, Noel, who runs our project, is going to go out and do a full inspection on the bridge-

Jennifer Foster:

Okay.

Jack Farr:

... the road widening, the sidewalk job, everything.

Anne Foster:

Okay. All right. Hold on a minute. Sidewalk job and everything.

Melissa Decker:

And what did Robin say? What did you say, Robin, that had, was addressed to us?

Robin Waizenegger:

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I just wondered if that was part of the full inspection on the bridge. That's all.

Anne Foster:

full inspection on the bridge. Okay.

Kelly Decker:

You will get an audio recording of this, Annie.

Anne Foster:

Oh. I will? Oh.

Kelly Decker:

Yes.

Group Member:

Yeah.

Anne Foster:

Oh. Okay.

Katie Horsham:

Sorry. I can't record your voice or take a picture, but you can ask me to take a note for you.

Anne Foster:

That's my new hub.

Regis Foster:

Google.

Anne Foster:

Oh. Google. He answered it. Okay. So, so we're going to get a recording, so we don't have to...

Jack Farr:

Um, I got a couple, not a couple of other things, but one other thing. As you notice out in front of City Hall, we completed the handicap ramp. Um.

Anne Foster:

Yeah. I see that.

Jack Farr:

I was promised that this Wednesday, the railings will be installed. I will double check with the installer.

Anne Foster:

Uh-huh.

Jack Farr:

... to be sure he's going to come Wednesday to do them. Um, we actually have less than the one inch per foot, because we extended it, so we made sure we were within compliance of ADA regulations.

Robin Waizenegger:

Okay. Yeah. If you stopped and looked, that ramp work is really terrific.

Group Member:

It is.

Robin Waizenegger:

... did a great job on that.

Group Member:

Mm-hmm (affirmative).

Jack Farr:

Thank you.

Jennifer Foster:

Yeah. It does look really nice.

Jack Farr:

It will definitely hold up the people from the parking lot using a ramp that don't need to be using a ramp, because now they have to walk twice as far.

Robin Waizenegger:

Yeah.

Robin Waizenegger:

And we, of course, are working with COVID-19, and the mayor and I discussed the reopening and the fact that when we reopen, at a minimum, we'll have to have two access doors, because the front door is the handicap access to the first floor, and the side door off the parking lot is actually the handicap access with the elevator for the basement and the second floor. So that'll be an issue for us when we reopen, is control of the two doors.

Jack Farr:

There's Katie. Yell up the street, Katie. I can hear you.

Group Member:

(laughs)

Kelly Decker:

Can you hear us now, Katie? Yes? No. You're going to have to unmute yourself.

Jack Farr:

Yeah. She can hear us.

Melissa Decker:

We can't hear her.

Jennifer Foster:

Yeah. She just texted me.

Kelly Decker:

So that's the video one. There should be one with a microphone next to it, or two over. Because it's, it, it doesn't allow me to unmute you.

Katie Horsham:

I have no clue.

Kelly Decker:

There you go. You got it.

Group Member:

You got it. Yay. Welcome.

Katie Horsham:

Sorry. I'm new to Zoom.

Kelly Decker:

I need you to do a roll call, so, uh, just state your first and last name and say present.

Katie Horsham:

Uh, Katie Horsham. Present.

Kelly Decker:

Thank you.

Jack Farr:

Other than that, Jen, we're going to, we're going to continue on our blacktopping plan on Main Street, but luckily, we don't have any handicap ramps to do, because they were all installed, um, through the project. So, um, we're going to be re-blacktopping the, uh, entire sidewalk project and the portions of North and South Maple that weren't included in the, um, bridge project.

Jennifer Foster:

Mm-hmm (affirmative). Good.

Jack Farr:

Other than that, Jen, I don't have anything else, unless we have any other complaints from anyone.

Jennifer Foster:

No, no, no. Melissa?

Melissa Decker:

Yes.

Jennifer Foster:

Do you have anything to, uh, anything?

Melissa Decker:

I just remember the last, I don't have anything to, um, to discuss regarding complaints at all, but I remember the last meeting, we talked about, uh, what our money situation was like.

Jennifer Foster:

That's correct. Yes. Yes.

Melissa Decker:

And, uh, I kind of left not knowing, like, how that was going to be spent or that we weren't going to spend it. Do you remember?

Jennifer Foster:

Uh-huh.

Jack Farr:

I do. What, what we talked about, and was, I believe that was discussed, was they were looking at using that money to make the website handicap accessible.

Jennifer Foster:

Oh. Yes.

Jack Farr:

Is that correct?

Jennifer Foster:

Yes. Yes.

Kelly Decker:

Right. We just haven't, uh, you know, with COVID, just things are on the back burner with the website, because I, I'm not going to be able to get somebody to do design. Um, so that's just on hold for now. That's all.

Melissa Decker:

Okay.

Jennifer Foster:

Anything else? No? Okay. No? Okay.

Jack Farr:

I got nothing.

Jennifer Foster:

Do you want me to... Let's see. When do you guys want to set the next meeting? August?

Jack Farr:

Um.

Jennifer Foster:

September?

Jack Farr:

I mean, if you want to go back to the same night as the DPW, August 3 would be the August DPW meeting.

Jennifer Foster:

Okay. Melissa, is that good for you?

Melissa Decker:

Yeah. It's good for me.

Jennifer Foster:

Katie?

Jack Farr:

She's retired now. Any day's good for her.

Melissa Decker:

I'm not retired 'til October.

Jennifer Foster:

Oh. That's right yeah.

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Melissa Decker:

I'm not retired 'til October. I feel like it, though. I've been working from home since March.

Jennifer Foster:

Oh. Good for you. Katie, is that good for you?

Katie Horsham:

Yeah. That should be good.

Jennifer Foster:

Okay.

Melissa Decker:

What, what time?

Jennifer Foster:

6:20.

Jack Farr:

Typically 6:30, 6:45.

Jennifer Foster:

Want to do 6:45? You can start at, what, 6:00 for DPW?

Jack Farr:

Yes.

Jennifer Foster:

6:45? 6:45, then. That good, Katie and Melissa?

Melissa Decker:

Yes. It's good for me.

Jennifer Foster:

Okay.

Katie Horsham:

Yeah.

Jennifer Foster:

Okay. 6:45 on the 3rd.

Melissa Decker:

Hopefully.

Robin Waizenegger:
Fingers crossed.

Jack Farr:
Mayor, are you starting the council meetings in the building starting the beginning of July?

Kelly Decker:
Starting July, yes. Uh, there will be, uh, uh, council meetings in the building.

Kelly Decker:
Yes.

Robin Waizenegger:
Great.

Jack Farr:
Okay.

Jennifer Foster:
All right. We'll adjourn 7:10.

Okay. Jen, I'm going to send you an email of this audio file. You'll have it. But then I'm also going to send out for the transcripts.

And you'll get a copy of the transcripts. You just have to go through them, make sure that it identifies the right person, and, that's speaking, okay?

You have any issues with that, call me, because I've been working with it for the last three months.
